Unit System

Section E. 2. A. of the program policies and procedures states: 4-year-old division only: 15% of the foal nomination funds will be used for the foal nominator awards. -Awards will be split equally between the current nine levels (open, intermediate open, limited open, non-pro, intermediate non-pro, limited non-pro, amateur, intermediate amateur, limited amateur) and pay the nominator of the foals for the top three placing horses plus ties in each level based on the **unit system**.

The current unit system states that each place is assigned a value based on the number of holes paid. For example, if 3 holes are paid, then:

- 1st place = 3 units
- 2nd place = 2 units
- 3rd place = 1 unit

This creates a total of 6 units (3 + 2 + 1).

The total amount to be paid is then divided by the total number of units to determine the dollar value per unit. Using the 2026 show year's foal calculation as an example:
 $\$13,703 \div 6 \text{ units} = \$2,283.89 \text{ per unit}$

Payouts are then calculated by multiplying the number of units assigned to each placing by the dollar value per unit:

- 1st place: $3 \times \$2,283.89 = \$6,851.67$
- 2nd place: $2 \times \$2,283.89 = \$4,567.78$
- 3rd place: $1 \times \$2,283.89 = \$2,283.89$

- Continue to utilize the unit system for nominator awards.
- Keep nominator awards the same, but use percentages: 1st place – 50%, 2nd place – 33.33%, and 3rd place – 16.67%, plus ties in each level.
- Utilize weekend payout scale for nominator awards: 1st place – 50%, 2nd place – 30%, and 3rd place – 20%, plus ties in each level.
